HINTS AND TIPS FOR COMPETITORS.

Farm and Garden;

1. Read your schedule carefully. This will eliminate entries being put into the wrong classes
2. Make sure all vegetables are freshly picked and clean
3. Must be evenly sized. Biggest is not always best.
4. Fruit and vegetables entered by children must have been grown by them, not taken from parents or grandparents gardens.
5. Rhubarb – at least 2 inches of green leaf left at the top and the base trimmed neatly

Flowers;

1. Must be freshly picked
2. Check for no insect bites or wind damage
3. Please enter in the correct classes/category

Children's Floral;

1. **MUST BE THE WORK OF THE CHILD** (The judge knows the difference and has the right to disqualify the entry)

Preserving;

1. Jars used for jam must be cleaned and labels removed. If unable to remove labels, cover with a white sticker
2. Jar to be filled to neck
3. No fancy covers on lids
4. Sauce bottles must be filled to the neck of bottle

Cooking;

1. Only one entry from each batch of cooking
2. Must be same size, shape and colour
3. No packet cake mixes to be used

Girls and Boys Cooking;

1. Must be Childs Own Work

Needlework and Craft;
